This can include items related to Social Collaboration, Content Management and Business applications exposed within the portal. Applies roles and security to Spaces.	Assigns privileges to various Community Managers to allow them to create and manage Spaces within the system. The portal administrator can also export and import resources between Spaces. Works with System Administration to migrate between environments.	Designs templates that will be used to create the look and feel of the portal pages. Often times this role will only need to be engaged periodically, as out of the box templates provide a range of display options for content and effort from the design team is generally spent with "branding" the portal.	Creates portlets that can be used to surface information from backend systems. WebCenter provides technology to interoperate with .NET or Java, as well as data technology that expedites development using visual drag and drop development.	The System Administrator focuses on installation, upgrades and troubleshooting. Will potentially be involved in migration of assets between environments.
